TIP

It's the little moments that help the student remember and develop a personal connection to the college. So, nothing is too small to note! Who knows? The smallest detail may help you later on when you write your supplemental essays for that school.

LOCATION & SETTING

What is the weather like? Is the campus large or small? What feeling do I get from the campus itself? What kind of transportation is available to and from campus? What is the closest airport/train station/bus station? Will I need a car to get around? What is near campus (parks, restaurants, venues, coffee shops, grocery stores, nightlife, culture, etc.)?

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ACADEMICS

Does the college offer a wide variety of classes? Does the college offer an honors program? What kind of research opportunities does the college offer? What are the college's graduation and retention rates? What is the student to faculty ratio? What is the reputation of the major/program I am considering? What kind of academic support does the college offer?

TIP

Consider the competitiveness of the major/program as some are more selective than others. Business, computer science, science, and some other marquee programs at the college have much tougher admissions standards and thus the student must ensure they have plenty of target and likely choices on their list.

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STUDENT LIFE

What is the social scene like? What is the gender balance of the school? Is there diversity on campus? What are the extracurricular offerings like? What kind of traditions does the college have? Are there sporting events on campus? What are the intramural and club sports offered? Are there on-campus health/counseling services available?

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HOUSING & FACILITIES

Is housing guaranteed all four years? Do most students live on campus? What is the housing selection process like? What are the housing options (singles, doubles, apartments)? What amenities do dorms have? What recreational activities are available to students? Can we eat in the dining hall if we are visiting in person? Does the dining hall cater to dietary needs?

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AFTER GRADUATION

What type of job placement can I expect? Does this college have an extensive alumni network? What are the average starting salaries of this college's graduates? What is the average indebtedness of graduates? Does the college offer career services?

	TIP	Consider picking three characteristics that you are not willing to budge on and use those to inform your college list.
	TIP	There will be so many people trying to influence your list — admissions officers, parents, family members, friends, and counselors. Don't be swayed by superficial reasons or less meaningful characteristics. Just because it seems like everyone is applying to a particular college in your community doesn't mean it's right for you. And, just because it appears that a number of your classmates plan to apply to your dream college doesn't mean it should discourage you from applying.
