- Q=quarter, S=semester
- · Semester grades are recorded on Transcripts that colleges see over 4 years
- Semester grade is comprised of two quarters & the semester exam if taken (can exempt if A in CP courses)
- F's earn no credit & are NEVER removed from the student's transcript

College Prep with Distinction, College Prep, and General



- General Diploma (may limit college choice)
 - 24 Credits
 - Successfully pass all required core courses, four electives, one year of Health/PE, and be in good conduct standing.
 - 4 Bible
 - 4 Mathematics
 - 4 English
 - 4 Science
 - 3 History

- 4 Electives** (.5 must be Speech, 3 must be For. Lang., Fine Art or YB/Media Arts)
- 1 PE/Health

**Beginning with the Class of 2028:

1 science credit must be Physical Science or Physics

1 elective credit must be Financial Literacy taken in 11 or 12



- College Preparatory
 - 27 Credits which includes all general diploma requirements....PLUS
 1 more credit in History & 2 credits (minimum) in a foreign language
 - 4 Bible
 - 4 Mathematics
 - 4 English
 - 4 Science
 - 4 History
 - 2 Foreign Language (minimum)

- 4 Electives** (.5 must be Speech, 1 must be 3rd year For. Lang., Fine Art or YB/Media Arts)
- 1 PE/Health

**Beginning with the Class of 2028:

1 science credit must be Physical Science or Physics1 elective credit must be Financial Literacy taken in 11 or 12



- College Preparatory with Distinction
 - 28 Credits which includes all College Preparatory diploma requirements....PLUS
 - 1 more credit <u>with</u> any combination of three "advanced level" classes (AP, College Dual Enrollment, or third/fourth year of a foreign language)
- 4 Bible
- 4 Mathematics
- 4 English
- 4 Science
- 4 History
- 2 Foreign Language (minimum)

- 5 Electives** (.5 must be Speech, 1 must be 3rd year For. Lang., Fine Art or YB/Media Arts)
- 1 PE/Health

**Beginning with the Class of 2028:

1 science credit must be Physical Science or Physics1 elective credit must be Financial Literacy taken in 11 or 12



- College Preparatory with Distinction
 - 28 Credits (1 above a College Prep Diploma)
 - PLUS a combination of any three of the following more rigorous courses:
 - Advanced Placement (AP)
 - Dual Enrollment
 - 3rd 4th year of Foreign Language

Any combo of three....

(2 AP + 1 Dual) (3 Dual) (2 Foreign Lang + 1 Dual)

Prescheduling Four Levels of Academic "Rigor"



- ➤ "CP" (College Prep)
 - Standard course
- ➤ "Honors"
 - More rigorous than "CP"
 - You must earn an "88 or higher" in the prerequisite course & have your teacher's recommendation
 - o Five quality points/ + .5 GPA pt. added at the end of each semester
- "Dual Enrollment" (available to Jrs & Srs)
 - More rigorous than "Honors"
 - PACS partnership with Truett-McConnell University & Point University

Prescheduling Four Levels of Academic "Rigor"




- "Dual Enrollment" (cont'd)
 - Earn high school and college credit at the same time
 - Must have a grade of 88 or better in the prerequisite course(s)
 - 10 quality points/ +1 GPA pt. added at the end of the semester
- > "AP" (Advanced Placement) (available to Sophs, Jrs & Srs)
 - College Board regulates (national level)
 - Must have a grade of 88 or better in the prerequisite course(s)
 - Some College admissions look most favorably on AP
 - High school credit guaranteed, and college credit for those that pass the national exam in May
 - 10 quality points/+1 GPA pt. added at end of semester

Prescheduling Bible




- ➤ Bible I (9th Grade)
 - · The Gospels with a focus on the life of Christ and salvation
- ➤ Bible II (10th Grade)
 - Hermeneutics-practical study for reading, interpreting, and applying the Bible of the Old & New Testament books
- ➤ Bible III (11th Grade)
 - Doctrine-systematic Theology (organizing the teachings of the Bible into categorical stems/topics)
- ➤ Bible IV (12th Grade)
 - Apologetics-Answering the question "Why do we believe what we believe?"



Math (common progression)





Science (common progression)







Financial Literacy



- Beginning with the Class of 2028, 1 semester of Financial Literacy will be required.
- We will offer this course next year as an elective.
- Financial Literacy ...provides students with essential knowledge and skills to manage personal finances, covering topics such as budgeting, saving, investing, and credit through hands-on projects, including creating personal budgets, developing investment portfolios, and analyzing financial decisions in real-life scenarios.
