Middle to High School Transition (credit by the semester, transcript begins, etc.)

DE	n/a	n/a	Varies based on college requirements, see syllabus for exam %

- Q=quarter S=semester
- Semester grade is comprised of two quarters & the semester exam if taken (students can EXEMPT if A in CP courses)
- Semester grades are recorded on a TRANSCRIPT that colleges see. It is CUMULATIVE & includes ALL GRADES earned in HIGH SCHOOL (even if taken in MS)
- F's earn no credit & are NEVER removed from the student's transcript

Diploma Types-Credits/Units



- The term credits and units are essentially the same thing, used interchangeably to measure academic progress. You earn them by passing courses. At Prince you earn .5 credit by the semester.
 - Each diploma type requires a different number of credits

➤ General Diploma (may limit college choice)

- **24 Credits**

- Successfully pass all required core courses, four electives, one year of Health/PE, and be in good conduct standing.

- 4 Bible

- 4 Mathematics

- 4 English

- 4 Science**

- 3 History

- **4 Electives****

- .5 must be Speech

- .5 must be For. Lang., Fine Art or YB/Media Arts

- .5 must be Fin. Lit. 11/12

- **1 Str Cond/Health**

- 4 Electives**
 - ❑ .5 must be Speech
 - ❑ .5 must be For. Lang., Fine Art or YB/Media Arts
 - ❑ .5 must be Fin. Lit. 11/12

1 science credit must be Physical Science or Physics

➤ College Preparatory with Distinction

- **28 Credits** which includes all College Preparatory diploma requirements....PLUS
 - 1 more credit with any combination of three “advanced level” classes (AP, College Dual Enrollment)

- 4 Bible
- 4 Mathematics
- 4 English
- 4 Science**
- 4 History
- 2 Foreign Language (minimum)

- **4 Electives****

- .5 must be Speech
- .5 must be For. Lang., Fine Art or YB/Media Arts
- .5 must be Fin. Lit. 11/12

- **1 Str Cond/Health**

**Beginning with the Class of 2028:

1 science credit must be Physical Science or Physics

Types of Diplomas



- College Preparatory with Distinction
 - 28 Credits (1 more than a College Prep Diploma)
 - PLUS a combination of any three of the following more rigorous courses:

- Advanced Placement (AP)
- Dual Enrollment

Any combo of 3 units....

- (2 credits AP + 1 credit Dual)
- (3 credits Dual)
- (1 credit AP + 2 credits Dual)

Academic Rigor

Course Level Grade Pre-Requisites:



- CP to H, AP.....95 or above in previous years subject area class
 - CP to DE.....88 or above in previous years subject area class
 - H,AP, DE to H,AP,DE.....88 or above in previous years subject area class
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Prescheduling

Four Levels of Academic “Rigor”



- “CP” (College Prep) Standard course

- “Honors” More rigorous than “CP”
 - Meet Grade Pre-Req requirements
 - Complete required pre-requisite course(s) and/or enrolled in required co-requisite course(s) for the course
 - Five quality points/ + .5 GPA pt. added at the end of each semester

Prescheduling

Four Levels of Academic “Rigor”



➤ “Dual Enrollment” (available to Jrs & Srs) More rigorous than “Honors”

- PACS partners with Truett-McConnell University & Point University
- Earn high school and college credit at the same time
- Meet Grade Pre-Req requirements
- Complete required pre-requisite course(s) and/or enrolled in required co-requisite course(s) for the course
- Must have at least a 3.0 GPA
- High school credit & college credit guaranteed with passing grade
- 10 quality points/ +1 GPA pt. added at the end of the semester

Four Levels of Academic “Rigor”




➤ “AP” (Advanced Placement) (available to Sophs, Jrs & Srs)

- College Board regulates (national level)
 - Meet Grade Pre-Req requirements
 - Complete required pre-requisite course(s) and/or enrolled in required co-requisite course(s) for the course
 - Some College admissions look more favorably on AP
 - High school credit guaranteed & college credit for those that pass the national exam in May (score 0-5)
 - 10 quality points/+1 GPA pt. added at end of semester

courses




Prescheduling Bible



- **Bible I (9th Grade)**
 - Focus on discipleship through the Gospels.
- **Bible II (10th Grade)**
 - Hermeneutics-practical study for reading, interpreting, and applying the Bible of the Old & New Testament books
- **Bible III (11th Grade)**
 - Doctrine-systematic Theology (organizing the teachings of the Bible into categorical stems/topics)
- **Bible IV (12th Grade)**
 - Apologetics-Answering the question “Why do we believe what we believe?”

Rising SENIORS...if you score a 3 or higher on the AP Eng. exam this May, that is the equivalent to completing EN101. Scores are not released until July. You will have to guesstimate in our Feb. advisement meeting and choose to take one of the following courses fall/spring:

- EN102/202
- EN102/CP Rhet. & Comp.
- EN102/Lit. Types & Comp.

After scores are released, you can decide for sure in August...once you are in...you **MUST** stay in those classes for the year. No dropping EN202 later.



Math (common progression)




★ When entering Math Course Request, multiple options may appear, choose the course next in progression. Counselor will ensure you have chosen correct course at advisement meeting.

Financial Literacy



- Beginning with the Class of 2028, 1 semester of Financial Literacy will be required in 11th or 12th grade
- We will offer this course next year as an elective.
- **Financial Literacy** . . .*provides students with essential knowledge and skills to manage personal finances, covering topics such as budgeting, saving, investing, and credit through hands-on projects, including creating personal budgets, developing investment portfolios, and analyzing financial decisions in real-life scenarios.*
